

Biodata for M. Ali Khan

M. Ali Khan graduated with First Class Honours from The London School of Economics (LSE) in 1969, and obtained an M. Phil. in 1972, and a Ph. D. in 1973, both from Yale University. On graduation, he was appointed as Assistant Professor at the Johns Hopkins University, and in 1989, as the Abram Hutzler Professor of Political Economy, a position he has held since. Currently, he is the Visting Goh Kang Swee Professor at the National University of Singapore.

Khan has also been a Professor at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (1984-1988), and has held visiting appointments at the LSE, Northwestern University, Cornell University, Pakistan Institute of Development Economics, Applied Economics Research Centre (Karachi), Bilkent University (Turkey), Fundaçao Getilio Vargas (Brazil), CORE (Belgium), The Australian National University, Maison de Economique (Paris), IMS at the National University of Singapore, ISI (Delhi) and the CMM at the Universidad Chile

Khan's research interests, and publications, include economic dynamics, game theory, economic development, ethics and epistemology, and the history of economic thought.
